### **Course Description:**

The focus of this course is on the Wide Area Network (WAN) technologies and network services required by converged applications in a complex network. In this course, students will learn the selection criteria of network devices and WAN technologies to meet network requirements. 2 hrs. lecture, 3 hrs. lab/wk.

### **Course Objectives:**

Students who complete this course will be able to perform the following functions:

- 1. Describe different WAN technologies and their benefits.
- 2. Configure and troubleshoot Point-to-Point Protocol (PPP).
- 3. Configure PPP over Ethernet (PPPoE), Generic Routing Encapsulation (GRE), and single-homed Border Gateway Protocol (eBGP).
- 4. Configure and troubleshoot extended IPv4 and IPv6 Access Control Lists (ACLs).

- 5. Explain how to mitigate common Local Area Network (LAN) security attacks.
- 6. Describe Quality of Service (QoS) operation.
- 7. Describe evolving networks including cloud, virtualization, Software Defined Networking (SDN) and the Internet of Things (IoT).
- 8. Troubleshoot end-to-end connectivity in a small to medium-sized business network, using a systematic approach.
