



- I realize that there is a language barrier between me and the instructor (and probably a cultural one, as well). Even with those facts in mind, I found this class to be an entirely negative experience. The lab information we were supplied with was riddled with errors; assignments and due dates were changed without notice; portions of the canvas site, including links to class critical software such as the VPN were blocked from access, and poor or missing instructions, such as which lab to use in order complete assignments (there were two full sets of lab topologies and the professor switched back and forth between them arbitrarily, and often without communicating when he did so), made this class easily the worst experience I have had at JCCC.
