# JCCC wants to help you celebrate Asian & Pacific Islander Heritage Month!

May is Asian/Pacific American Heritage Month – a celebration of Asians and Pacific Islanders in the United States. A rather broad term, Asian/Pacific encompasses all of the Asian continent and the Pacific islands of Melanesia, Micronesia and Polynesia.

Like most commemorative months, Asian/Pacific American Heritage Month originated with Congress. In in June 1978, Rep. Horton introduced a resolution that proposed that the President should "proclaim a week, which is to include the seventh and tenth of the month, during the first ten days in May of 1979 as 'Asian/Pacific American Heritage Week.'" This joint resolution was passed by the House and then the Senate and was signed by President Jimmy Carter on October 5, 1978. In 1990 Congress expanded the observance to a month. Then in 1992, Congress designated May as Asian/Pacific American Heritage Month. The month of May was chosen to commemorate the immigration of the first Japanese to the United States on May 7, 1843, and to mark the anniversary of the completion of the transcontinental railroad on May 10, 1869. The majority of the workers who laid the tracks were Chinese immigrants.

The best way to celebrate AAPI Heritage Month are to take time to learn more about the many cultures encompassed in the acronym. We encourage you to learn about the history of Asian and Pacific Islander immigrants, to try new foods, to listen to new music and to support art made by the individuals belonging to these communities.
